The new European Solidarity Corps supports the European Union's political priorities and engages both organisations and young people in projects to help support them. Particularly, the programme:

- <u>Promotes inclusion and diversity</u>, and aims to provide all young people with equal access to European Solidarity Corps opportunities.
- Aims to adopt <u>green practices</u> across all projects and activities, as well as to promote environmentally sustainable and responsible behaviour among both participants and organisations.
- Contributes to the <u>digital transition</u> by supporting projects and activities that work to boost digital skills, foster digital literacy, and develop an understanding of the risks and opportunities of digital technology.
- Promotes <u>civic engagement and the participation</u> of young people in democratic processes.

Travel costs to Patras from the volunteer's home country and back are covered based on <u>following</u> <u>limits</u>




Food allowance is provided (5E/per day)

Living in Patras


Our city is Patras in Greece. Located in northern Peloponnese, Patras is Greece's third-largest city, just 215 km west of Athens. The city is built at the foothills of Mount Panachaikos, overlooking the Gulf of Patras. It has a population of more than 215.000 habitants out of whom some 50.000 are young students - so we are proud to be quite a young city!

Dubbed as Greece's gate to the West, Patras is a commercial hub, while its busy ports are a nodal point for trade and communication with Italy and Western Europe. The city has three public universities and hosts a large student population and rendering Patras a major scientific center.

Patras is also famous for its carnival. The Patras Carnival, Patrino karnavali is the largest event of its kind in Greece and one of the biggest in Europe. It has more than 180 years of history.

The carnival of Patras is not a single event but a variety of events that includes balls, parades, hidden treasure hunt and the children's carnival amongst others. It climaxes in the last weekend of Carnival with the Saturday evening parade of carnival groups, the extravagant Sunday parade of floats and groups, and finally the ritual burning of the carnival king at the St. Nikolaos Street pier in the harbor of Patras.

Patras is vivid and friendly, with loads of interesting activities and hidden treasures. It also has many-many kilometers of beaches and the best sunset in Greece (that is objectively confirmed by all citizens of the city)!

Recognition of Learning Outcomes

At the end of the volunteering experience of the European Solidarity Corps, each volunteer writes a document in which they describe their learning path: the YouthPass. This is a certificate that will be issued to you at the end of your placement and which lays out what you learned during your project.

To make sure your learning process and achievements are properly documented, it makes sense to start reflecting on and describing your learning as early as possible. Regularly reviewing your achievements helps you to become aware of what you have learned, find the words to describe it, and plan your further learning.

In your Youthpass, the skills, knowledge and attitudes you developed can be assigned to 8 key competence areas (and more). These are:
